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Faithfulness: a wonderful principle

THE mechanism of the human body is a wonder. The operation of its organs results in that which we call life. This life manifests its presence through the senses and through motion. Moreover, we know that the habits a person makes will, in the long run, shape his character, and that character will be his identity.

By the Universal Law, we know what is law-abiding and what is lawless, that is to say, what does us good and what harms us, and the choice is ours. We are used to the bad things, owing to having practised them. Whereas the good things are new to us because we have not done them. We readily leave aside some bad things because they have always disgusted us. But if we have become accustomed to some bad things, once having tried them, it is no longer such an easy matter, with all the goodwill in the world. They have grown tendrils and roots, and to weed them out is an arduous task. Nevertheless, when we become aware of their lawlessness, we must do what is needful to get rid of them, because, in the long run, they will do us a deal of harm. There are things that are able to give us a moment's pleasurable sensations, momentary gratification. They do not appear to be harmful. Nevertheless, the outcome of practising them is always bad, and that is why we need to get away from them by practising to be faithful to what is good.

Faithfulness is a virtue that the world cannot contemplate, because the world is not faithful. It may, of course, be faithful to its own principles, but since these are entirely wrong, there can be no question of faithfulness according to the word in its true sense. When you get down to brass tacks, to be faithful to what is wrong means that one is unfaithful to one's fellow creatures, since it can lead only to bad results. Therefore, it is faithfulness which is none, for faithfulness is a wonderful virtue that implies something glorious, ineffable and sublime, and that does good and creates blessing, blessing that finally results in no disappointment.

Therefore, it is possible to contemplate being faithful only to things in accordance with the law, things that are good. Only then can there be a question of faithfulness. Concerning this, our dear Saviour said: "He who faithful in very little is also faithful in much."

Life is made up of very small details, and this assemblage of quite small things finally makes up some big ones. After all, there is nothing of secondary consideration, everything is important, because it is the sum of the many bad impressions we have received that earns us, as the Apostle Paul indicates to the Romans, "the wages of sin", which is death.

Thus, it is the sum of an infinite number of small lawless things, which have accumulated, that leads, in the end, to the destruction of the body. Never in the past would we have thought that sin was simply everything that was harmful to us. We used to think that it was a pity that such and such a thing was a sin. Had it not been, we should have indulged in it to the hilt of our bent. Of course, we were uninstructed and ignorant, and that was why we saw things in that way. Indeed, so many things that procure us some very pleasant sensations, at the time, contain within themselves a hook that is fatal to us. It is like a net that is laid out, and we shall not fail to be enmeshed if we do not struggle free. Thus, we can see how obligatory it is to act on divine principles.

Thanks to the wonderful Universal Law, everything can now be very easily made out and set in its place. We call that law "Universal" because it is to be met with everywhere. If we will resolutely take our stand on its principles, we shall always remain upright, and we shall be able to distinguish between what is faithfulness and what is unfaithfulness.

To be faithful is to exist for the good of our fellow creatures, to help them, support them, love them and show them kindness, but never to scold or command, since our ideal is to arrive at serving and at the wonderful glory of children of God. Then, evil begins, and a multitude of minor infidelities insinuate themselves into our behaviour. We often declare some small defect has no importance, that it is of such small account that we can very well let it be. That is a mistake. We absolutely must stick to the divine principles if we want to obtain blessing.

To stick to the principles is to cling to life. Today, the

Almighty is working on setting up a new family on our planet, a family who has to be educated and to then take the place of the present one. Our affection, our efforts and our every desire must conduce to achieve that new condition of life, while honouring the duties we have taken on ourselves. six of whom lost their lives. The lifeboats could not be launched in time. The four survivors had already been swimming for six hours, frantically calling for help in the immense sea, where no ship appeared. Their strength was waning; they were beginning to stiffen.

It was at this moment that two dolphins suddenly approached. At first, the shipwrecked men clung to the dolphins' backs as best they could; then, the sea animals dived a little under the weakened men. The men instinctively held on tightly. As soon as the dolphins became aware of this, they began to swim faster and faster, one behind the other, carrying a double load on each of their backs. The dolphins swam 36 nautical miles [approximately 67 kilometres] to the coast of Noshima-saki, where they threw off the survivors in a decisive way. Then, they swam around them several times, to make sure that the men were able to walk the last few hundred metres that separated them from the shore. Then, they disappeared into the sea.

This is how the 28-year-old survivor Nirumi Ikeda described the event: "At the prospect of drowning, we were overcome by anguish. At that moment, I turned around and shouted to Ogata [another fisherman]: 'Here come the dolphins! They are animals that come to the rescue of humans.' Swimming a few meters away from me, Ogata shouted with his last strength: 'Don't believe in miracles!' Then, I heard a gurgling sound. A dolphin was approaching me, blowing large air bubbles. I later understood that it was doing this to bend and straighten its back. We were very weak, so when the huge animal forcefully pushed us and pressed us under water, Ogata yelled out that "it wants to kill us". I also thought that it was no better than a shark. But then I held on firmly to its back. I literally grabbed its body and clung to it like a claw. I must have hurt the dolphin, but it let me do it. I then quickly decided, once and for all, to climb on top of it like a horse, and it began to gurgle again. It swam with me towards Ogata, and then nudged him, until he also sat on it. Minuro and Amatoka [the other fisherman] saw this.

The second dolphin seemed to have been waiting for what its big brother would do, maybe its example. So, it did the same thing for the other two fisherman, who were still calling for help. We were more clinging than sitting on the backs of the dolphins, but we were going at full speed and thus travelled the 36 nautical miles of water separating us from the shore, which we would never have seen again without the dolphins."

The sculptor Ogo will erect a monument to dolphins, on the spit of land at Noshima-saki. These clever animals had already saved the three men of a motorboat crew from the coastal city of Kamogawa in 1961. Also on that occasion, for a few weeks after their rescue feat, the dolphins returned to the shore, where they liked to play with the men and let themselves be fed by them. Then one day, they disappeared into the vast ocean.

That occurrence is really very touching. It once again shows us the solidarity that should exist among all beings, according to the principles of the Universal Law. We have often had the opportunity to read interesting reports about dolphins, which seem to be among the most intelligent marine animals, and which allow themselves to be approached and even stroked by humans. The same applies to some types of sea lions and seals.

We are happy to report this fact. It is also an encouragement for people to become true friends to all of the animal kingdom that surrounds them. Unfortunately, it is often the opposite. It is no exaggeration to say that many animals suffer mainly because of human wickedness and brutality.

Always the problem of CO,

In the column "Economie" ("Economy)" of the Swiss French-language newspaper *Tribune de Genève* on the 11th of July 2022, there was an article about a new technology that can capture the CO_2 (carbon dioxide) that is released into the atmosphere. This technology seems to be very promising for the engineers in this activity sector and for the investors, and the mood is optimistic. We quote the text by Mr Nicolas Pinguely in its entirety:

The capture of CO₂.

For the Swiss company Climeworks, the day of recognition has come. Climeworks has developed a giant carbon-dioxide vacuum cleaner to purify the atmosphere. Investors, researchers and companies flocked to its conference day.

There was a festive air in the Swiss city of Zurich, in early July. In the former industrial area of Oerlikon, Climeworks brought together nearly 600 people: scientists, financiers, nongovernmental organizations, and companies, to talk about the climate and the technologies needed to remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere. A topic that is gaining momentum at a time when the fight against "climate change" ["global warming"] is on everybody's agenda. In the large meeting hall, the mood is festive. On the stage, discreet smoke and a soft blue-grey light accompany the different speakers. "We are going to build a second site, in Iceland, called Mammoth, to remove CO₂ from the air," announced Mr Jan Wurzbacher, a co-founder of Climeworks.

650 million US dollars

Climeworks was founded by two engineers from the ETH Zurich [Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Zurich], and has developed gigantic vacuum cleaners to siphon off the CO_2 . "We have just raised 650 million US dollars from institutional investors, including infrastructure and technology specialists," said Mr Christoph Gebald, the other co-founder of the company. Swiss Reinsurance Company Ltd [Swiss Re] has also invested in it.

It is true that Climeworks and the technologies that can remove carbon from the atmosphere, are attractive. "Financial flows are directed towards these solutions," says Mr Keith Tuffley, Citibank's Global Co-Head of Sustainability and Corporate Transitions.

Why are they so successful? Because the fight against climate change will not only require the reduction of CO_2 emissions, but also the removal of CO_2 from the atmosphere. It will be necessary to be "net zero", a term that was regularly mentioned by the speakers at the Zurich conference.

"Direct Air Capture" (DAC) technology is maturing. "DAC is exploding," says scientist Mr Suren Erkman. The two main pioneering companies in this field are the Swiss-based Climeworks and the Canadian-based Carbon Engineering. Climeworks CO_2 vacuum cleaners are a real eye opener. "Its technology is robust and proven," he said. "Furthermore, it is based on wellknown physical and chemical principles."

The process must be refined

However, the process will need to be refined in the future. Climeworks is working hard to make its technology more energy efficient. Because the technology needs a stable temperature to operate.

That is why the heat from the geothermal sources in Iceland is interesting for Climeworks. "In addition to natural sources, there are many industrial sources that can be used, from waste incinerators, to oil refineries and to cement factories," says Mr Suren Erkman.

The future looks bright for Climeworks. "Wind and solar energies followed the same path before they succeeded," said Mr Paul Judge, a general manager at General Electric, who attended the conference.

Still too expensive

However, the price remains an issue today. Climeworks CO_2 extraction costs are as high as 600 to 800 dollars per tonne, compared to about 80 dollars to buy a certificate to offset a company's emissions. But in the future, things are going to change.

"When the costs of Climeworks and the carbon tax are comparable, it will be as attractive to buy CO₂ removed from the atmosphere as it is to buy offset certificates," claims Mr Suren Erkman.

The challenges are enormous. Every year, 40 billion tonnes of carbon are emitted into the atmosphere. "The natural environments, forests, soils, fields and oceans, capture half of it," he adds.

Since the middle of the 18th century, the excess CO_2 generated by human activities amounts to 900 billion tonnes. An amount that has risen sharply in the last 10 years. "We are going to have to mine the atmosphere to remove some of the excess CO_{2r} " he also says.

Maximum 1.5 °C [degrees Celsius]

Scientists have set a maximum global warming of 1.5 °C as the target to limit the risk of climate disasters. This requires a drastic reduction of "greenhouse gases" in the atmosphere. "At the same time, we must be able to extract 10 billion tonnes of CO_2 every year from 2050 onwards to fight against climate change," continues Mr Suren Erkman. Currently, only a few thousand tonnes are being removed every year.

What happens to this CO_2 ? The carbon extracted from the atmosphere can be recycled. "It can be used as synthetic fuel, transformed into plastic, used in carbonated drinks or serve as a fertilizer," he explains.

In fact, CO_2 will become a source of income for companies. "In the coming years, industrial applications could absorb several billion tonnes every year," this scientist predicts.

However, the amounts that need to be removed from the atmosphere are gigantic. "That is why most of it will need to be stored in geological structures for hundreds of years," he warns. But they will be a great distance from the city of Zurich. At cocktail hour, the scientists and bankers are chatting. Their faces are smiling. For Climeworks, this is "very" interesting.

One must emphasize the ingenuity and the abilities of the co-founders of this project. One must first figure out how to extract CO_2 from the atmosphere, especially by finding a way of doing it perhaps at a high but still acceptable price. Truly, humankind have received fantastic abilities from their Creator, the Almighty.

As everyone knows, a high level of carbon dioxide (CO_2) is a significant cause of environmental pollution. It is considered as a greenhouse gas, and a high level of it contributes to global warming. Since the beginning of the Industrial Age, large amounts of this gas have been released into the atmosphere. The above article montions the figure of 900 billion tennes, which repre-

sents a considerable quantity. Because carbon dioxide has a density of 1.977 grams per litre [g/L], this would equate to the volume of approximately 450,000 billion cubic metres [m³]. A reduction of CO_2 emissions would not be enough to stop global warming, which is why the possibility of capturing CO_2 from the atmosphere would contribute to reducing the feared warming effect.

The co-founders have even considered solutions to recycle this CO₂ into forms of fuel, etc. One may well say that humankind have tried everything. However, we know that the definitive solution for all problems does not lie here. It is only God Who has it. Therapy with animals

When animals heal

We know them as faithful companions in life. But they are also fabulous nursing assistants. Some pets are increasingly used for their therapeutic "virtues". The reason? An extraordinary "emotional intelligence", which has been underestimated for far too long...and from which we could draw inspiration.

Activities with guinea pigs in nursing homes; the presence of dogs in reading classes; horses in "relationstraining" courses; cats in "resensitization" sessions with prisoners convicted of violent crimes... In the United States, this is called "pet therapy" ["animal therapy" or "animal-assisted therapy"]. In our country [Belgium], we prefer to use the terms "animal mediation" or "animal-facilitated therapy". For some vulnerable groups (the elderly, prisoners, or people with illnesses or disabilities), the presence of a domestic animal can recuperate or give the desire to move again or to talk or interact with others. Our "animal friends", through their instinctively nonjudgmental and authentic behaviour, can produce reactions that are favourable to psychological and physical well-being.

Furry or feathered therapists

In the 19th century, in Belgium, the first example of the voluntary use of animals for human mental health, was observed. In 1860, the French journalist Mr. Jules Duval

writes in his French-language book Gheel, une colonie d'aliénés [Gheel, a Colony of Insane People] about the case of a group of patients suffering from psychological disorders, who were interned in the Flemish city of Gheel (nowadays Geel), and who were entrusted with the care of birds during their recovery. By taking care of an animal, the patient learns to take better care of themself, noted the doctors of the time. It was in the 1950s that animal-assisted therapy really saw the light of day, thanks to Mr Boris Levinson, an American child psychiatrist. One day in his practice, he spoke with a married couple who brought along their young autistic son. The parents were distraught at the thought of their son going into a specialized institution. By chance, Levinson forgot the presence of his dog, Jingle, which slept in the corner of his office. Unexpectedly, Jingle woke up with the arrival of the family, and went to greet the little boy, who, in front of his amazed parents, began to pat the dog and pay attention to it. Levinson then started a therapy programme involving Jingle, which led to very clear progress of the little boy, and which prevented him from being placed in an institution.

For the first time, a pet became a "cotherapist". In other words, it placed itself as a mediator within a now triangular relationship among the practitioner, the animal and the patient. Mocked at the time by the profession, Levinson's work is now the subject of very serious studies, and practitioners may now willingly train in animal-assisted therapy, as is the case here in the Faculty of Social Sciences at the University of Liège, or at the Belgian Institute of Animal Therapy in area of Franc-Waret (near the city of Namur).

Don't say "IQ" anymore, say "EQ" instead!

Without verbal communication, a pet seeks interaction (no offence to cat owners!) It is spontaneous and stimulates, awakens and comforts in a natural way. A pet draws these qualities from a well-developed "emotional quotient" (EQ). In other words, it has a good control of its own emotions, but also a good understanding of others' emotions. Of course, not all animals have the same emotional intelligence. Therapy is usually carried out with specially trained animals in order to create a relationship with the patient. Pets also have a better emotional understanding of humans than wild animals. "Humans selected them for that," explains French behavioural-ecology professor Mr Loïc Ballache on the French website Le Devoir. "Pets are the result of artificial selection that aimed to choose the kindest individuals to humans. Empathy exists between individuals of the same species, but also between us humans and our pets. Your dog, or any other pet, watches you all day, because you are the one who feeds it, who pats it and who takes it for a walk. It is entirely dependent on you. It is extremely attentive to your slightest signs: it learns to decode everything about you. So, when you're not well, or when you're sad, it definitely perceives it.

An example to follow

We have become so convinced of the superiority that language gives us, that we have become very bad at communicating with the species around us. The world is constantly vibrating with messages from animals, to which we remain deaf. We are unable to accurately understand the neighing of a horse, or the meowing of a cat. Not to mention that we can't always communicate with our loved ones, that we don't always understand ourselves, and that we don't always know what we really want. What are we waiting for to follow "the animal example" to pay more attention, without judgment or comparison, to what surrounds us? And perhaps, at the same time, to come to understand each other better?

Everyone has surely heard that animals can have a beneficial influence on us, especially if we have difficulties or are sick. It is instructive for us to be aware that animals are sensitive to our emotions and can interpret them and act accordingly. Those who have a pet — be it a dog, cat or other animal — will have often noticed these abilities. We are reminded of many accidents in which dogs have sought help and saved their owners.

As Julien Marteleur writes, a pet doesn't judge us. That is what does us good. Because a person must not be judged, but be loved. If a person has failed us or if something is not right, it is very important for them to feel, above all, that this doesn't change anything about the friendly relations that we normally have with them.

The above article is accompanied by a photo of a little girl lying on a bed, possibly in a hospital. In her hands, she is holding a little cat, which she is kissing. The little cat is letting it happen and has closed its eyes. One can imagine that it is purring with happiness, and one can also imagine how good the natural attitude of this little companion is for the child.

That photo describes everything that is said in the article about the empathy that animals have, namely, that they can feel more than they can understand about what is going on around them.

That is a profound lesson for us. In fact, humankind were placed on Earth as the royalty of divine Creation, over which they should fulfil a role of protector and benefactor. Animals should approach humans and feel in that contact, what we should feel in contact with our Creator, and what we should transmit and pass on to them. Now, this article shows us the exact opposite. Here, animals have been called to do good to humans in difficulty. Once again, we are facing the obvious fact of our sin, which we are reminded of by creatures that we describe an inferior, but that show themselves to more capable than us in many circumstances.

How often do we feel helpless and speechless when facing someone who is going through a particular difficulty, a family drama or something else! Despite all our knowledge in psychology, philosophy, medicine, etc., we often don't know how to help our fellow person, and if we do perhaps find a few consoling words, they do not penetrate deeply into their heart, because we are not able to put ourselves in their position. We are not able to think about them and to thereby fully put aside our own problems and difficulties in order to feel the magnitude of the trial that they are going through.

For that to be possible, we would have to learn to love our neighbour, as our dear Saviour recommends us to. It is this inexpressibly altruistic sentiment that enables us to do good to our fellow person without judging them. Even if we might not be able to approve of what has happened between us and them, let them feel that this doesn't change the affection that we have for them. Then, when the occasion presents itself, when the wound has closed, one can kindly tell them the truth. It is an art to love and to be loved, which makes us inseparably attached to our fellow person and thereby also to our Creator, the Almighty. This makes us true friends and benefactors to our fellow person, and free people who live the Universal Law of altruism, who exist for the good, and only for the good, of those around them.

Until we have learned and expressed those wonderful feelings at the School of Christ, we will have to content ourselves with learning from our fine furry and feathered friends. May this lesson make us humbler and lead us to treat them appropriately, so that we no longer exploit them or use them to satisfy our moods, and rather respect them. They will know how to thank us.

The Prophet Isaiah, in chapter 11 of his book, gives us a poetic image of how so-called "wild" animals will live together with harmless animals, such as a wolf with a lamb, and a leopard with a kid. It was, in fact, humans who set the animals a bad example through the Fall into sin.

Let us therefore learn the lesson contained in this narrative. Let us not be of those who think they are superior and have a lot of knowledge and want to pass it on to others. If one thinks that one already knows everything, then one cannot learn anything else. Let us instead be aware that we can learn something from everyone. Then, we can do a lot of good around us, and that is what we are called to do.
